Methodology Statement

Latino Decisions surveyed a representative sample of 406 Latino registered voters in the city of Chicago between March 16 – 20, 2015. Surveys were implemented to randomly selected phone numbers, conducted via live, person-to-person (i.e. not robocalls) phone calls. Respondents were reached on a combination of both landline (70%) and mobile phones (30%). All interviewers were completely bilingual, surveys were completed in English or Spanish, according to the respondent's choice. In total 46% of interviews were conducted in Spanish and 54% were done in English. The survey carries a margin of error of +/-4.8 percentage points.
