Virginia 2017 Headlines

- People of color were decisive in Virginia 2017 from the top of the ticket to the bottom
- Gillespie's over-reliance on anti-immigrant and racebaiting ads completely backfired
- In the final 3 weeks there was noticeable increase in awareness of the candidate positions on immigration
- Voters recognized that Gillespie had heavily racialized the campaign and moved away from him


Virginia 2017 Headlines

- Pundits said this election was a referendum on immigration reform and the DREAM Act
- Virginians are pro-immigrant and support policy welcoming immigrants

Virginia 2017 Election Eve Poll

- Statewide poll of people who voted in the 2017 election, fielded Nov 2-6, 2017
- □ Large samples of Latinos (n=431), Asian Americans (n=404), African Americans (n=403), Whites (n=497)
- Screened sample to likely voters, then asked screening questions to identify certain voters only
- Available in English, Spanish, Chinese, Korean,
 Vietnamese

Anti-Immigrant Ads Backfired

During his campaign for governor, Ed Gillespie said that sanctuary cities which try to help immigrants are actually promoting violent gangs. He said illegal immigrants are a dangerous threat to public safety, and that immigrants from Central America are violent gang members who rape and kill people in Virginia.

this is really important: the Trump appeal *worked* in the most hard-core trump areas, which moved even further towards Gillespie. The backlash was just much much bigger










Aware of racialized campaign



Virginians are pro-immigrant

- Pundits said this election was a referendum on immigration reform and the DREAM Act
- Virginians are pro-immigrant and support policy welcoming immigrants
- Statewide 58 percent of all voters said that Northam's support for in-state tuition for DREAMers made them more enthusiastic about his campaign, only 30 percent were less enthusiastic, giving him a net overall boost of 28 points

What Virginia Tells Us About 2018

- Just like 2016, Latino and Asian American voters turned out at high rates to oppose a nativist campaign
- African American numbers were also up in Virginia
- Anti-immigrant campaign backfired
 - Angle, Tancredo, Brown, Guadagno, et. al.
- The vocal majority doesn't like racism calling out racism can mobilize voters against nativism
