

Latino Decisions tracking poll of Latino registered voters was conducted from August 13 – 26, 2010 with Latino registered voters in 21 states that comprised 94% of the Latino electorate in 2008. Interviews were conducted by telephone in English and Spanish, at the discretion of the respondent. 365 surveys were completed for a margin of error of +/- 5.1 percent.
