Methodology: This study was conducted March 25-April 5 by American Decisions and Latino Decisions. Interviews were completed by telephone, including 600 non-Latino and 400 Latino Registered Voters in California. Respondents answered in English or Spanish at their discretion. Results were weighted to known population characteristics using the Current Population Survey. The nominal margins-of-error are +/- 3.1% for the full sample, +/-4.0% on the non-Latino sample, and +/- 4.9% on the Latino sub-sample.
