- N=504 Puerto Rican registered voters in Florida
 - > 57% island-born; 43% U.S. mainland born
- Margin of error is +/- 4.4%
- > Field Dates: September 17 September 26, 2016
- > Blended live-call landline and mobile, and online
- > Available in Spanish or English at subject's discretion
- Content
 - Interest and Engagement in 2016 election
 - Candidate favorability and vote
 - Issue priorities and positions


















When it comes to voting, how much do you consider candidate views on Puerto Rico, and issues on the island in deciding who you will support?


Support for candidates based on policy positions (percent if <u>favor</u> of candidate who takes [stated position] reported)






Which of the following statements about voting in November presidential election describes you best?



In your opinion, does it matter who wins the 2016 presidential election?




Attention and Engagement by Nativity






