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Methodology

Latino Decisions implemented The Education and Border Community Study in March 2013 on behalf of the Texas State Teachers Association (TSTA). The study was implemented in El Paso, Laredo, and the Rio Grande Valley to assess public opinion on education topics including: perceptions about and interactions with local schools and teachers, educational aspirations, and policy-related issues. Four hundred Latino origin respondents in these Texas border metro areas were interviewed between March 14 and March 24, 2013. Telephone interviews over both landlines (80%) and cell phones (20%) lasted about 16 minutes and were conducted by fully bilingual interviewers. Half of all interviews were conducted in Spanish and half were conducted in English. The survey carries a 4.9% margin of error.
